<p>Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) – 3rd Ed.</p> <p>(purchase through Brookes Publishing)</p>	<p>1 month to 5½ years old</p>	<p>This system is designed to be implemented in a range of settings & can easily be tailored to fit the needs of many families. Features include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • available in English or Spanish • takes 10–15 minutes for parents to complete and 2–3 minutes for professionals to score • captures parents’ in-depth knowledge • highlights a child’s strengths as well as concerns • teaches parents about child development and their own child’s skills • highlights results that fall in a “monitoring zone” – easier to keep track of children at risk
<p>Ages and Stages Questionnaire: Social and Emotional (ASQ: SE) – 2nd Ed.</p> <p>(purchase through Brookes Publishing)</p>	<p>1 month to 6 years old</p>	<p>The ASQ: SE gives opportunity during the first few years of a child’s life to identify and address potential social-emotional concerns. The ASQ: SE design is similar to the Ages and Stages Questionnaire. It is a highly reliable, parent-completed tool with an exclusive focus on children’s social and emotional development. It aids in quick pinpointing of behaviors of concern and identify any need for further assessment or ongoing monitoring.</p>
<p>Early Screening Inventory- Preschool version (ESI- P)</p> <p>(purchase through Pearson)</p>	<p>3.5 to 5.11 years old</p>	<p>The ESI-P is a brief developmental screening instrument is easy and quick to administer, and is standardized on a large, diverse group of children from all ethnicities and socio-economic backgrounds. The ESI-P measures three areas: visual-motor/adaptive, language and cognition, and gross motor.</p>
<p>Pediatric Symptom Checklist (PSC)</p> <p>(public domain/no cost)</p>	<p>18 months to 5 years old</p>	<p>The PSC is a parent-completed psychosocial tool, used by pediatricians and other health professionals, designed to facilitate the recognition of cognitive, emotional, and behavioral problems so that appropriate interventions can be initiated as early as possible. It is available in many languages, including English, Spanish, Chinese, Hindi, Somali, and Portuguese.</p>
<p>Survey of Wellbeing in Children (SWYC)</p> <p>(public domain – no cost)</p>	<p>Under 5 years old</p>	<p>The SWYC is a freely-available, comprehensive screening instrument, written to be simple to answer, short, and easy to read. The entire instrument requires 15 minutes or less to complete. Every SWYC form includes sections on developmental milestones, behavioral/emotional development, and family risk factors. At certain ages, a section for Autism-specific screening is included. It is available in English, Spanish, Burmese, Nepali, and Portuguese.</p>
